

Located between Cluny and Mâcon, the Priory of Berzé-la-Ville was founded by Hugues de Semur, the Abbot of Cluny in the early 12th century.

A haven of peace for the abbot, he used it to receive guests of distinction and to escape from the intense political and religious life of the Abbey of Cluny. Today only the chapel can be visited. It was built on two levels. The superb 12th-century frescoes are conserved on the upper level. These are rare, exceptionally high quality examples of the wall painting of this period.

DID YOU KNOW...?

The murals were only rediscovered by Philibert Jolivet, the parish priest in 1887.


